24 art exhibits to check out in Columbus this fall: 2 Van Gogh features and much more

A sculptor who creates new works from old musical instruments, works by Columbus native son and renowned pop artist Roy Lichtenstein, contemporary art quilts from an international competition and two big — and very different — exhibits focusing on the works of Vincent Van Gogh are just a few of the coming highlights in the new season of visual arts.

Many of the exhibits will be held in person at museums or art centers but because of the pandemic and CDC guidelines, visitors should check all events before attending. Also because of the pandemic, many of the exhibits will be available to be seen online.

'Nina Katchadourian: To Feel Something That Was Not of Our World'

Before you go

As of press time, here are the COVID policies at area visual-arts venues. Check websites before visiting to confirm.

- Billy Ireland Cartoon Library & Museum: Ohio State guidelines will be followed, including a mask requirement.
- Capital University's Schumacher Gallery: Masks are required; no vaccination proof or negative test are required at present.
- Columbus Museum of Art: Masks are expected.
- **Cultural Arts Center:** City of Columbus guidelines will be followed, including a mask requirement inside buildings.
- Dublin Arts Council: Masks are required.

- Fort Hayes Gallery: Masks are required.
- "Immersive Van Gough Exhibit Columbus": Masks are required along with social distancing of six feet.
- Ohio Craft Museum: Masks are encouraged.
- Ohio Wesleyan University: Masks are required.
- Otterbein University: Masks are required.
- Pizzuti Collection: Masks are expected.
- Riffe Gallery: Masks encouraged.
